

October 8, 2003

- The meeting was started by Christina Zabat-Fran, the president, in the Locus at 6:05 PM.
- There were three handouts, which were: the year in perspective, an agenda, and "guide to OC".
- Everyone except for the officers introduced themselves.
- Christina Zabat-Fran stated that CHSC can become a significant organization both within CHP and in the UCI community through service and outreach.
- All the officers introduced themselves.
- Erkki Corpuz, the CHSC advisor, gave a brief introduction to CHSC history and told those in attendance that, if they wish to hold a particular officer position next year, they should speak to the person currently holding the office about getting involved.
- Christina Zabat-Fran then stated that the purpose of CHSC is to have activities that the membership wants.
- Some of the goals for this coming year for CHSC that were given by officers were: to make CHSC more accessible to freshmen and increasing the publicity of events (Doug Ishii, social chair), to integrate CHP events (Ryan Lombardini, academic affairs vice president), to raise \$100 profit through fundraising and to get more involvement in CHP (Bhishma Donnelly, treasurer), to keep CHP members in CHP by having great events (Christina Zabat-Fran), and to rewrite the CHSC constitution through a committee to be led by Christina Zabat-Fran and James Wenner (Erkki Corpuz).
- Amber Lakhani, one of the PAAs, said that the PAAs are thinking about a trip to the Disney Concert hall Friday of Week 8 to see the Berlin Philharmonic for about \$15 per person and asked how many people were interested; 19 people expressed an interest.
- Christina Zabat-Fran then stated that, in the Locus, there is a calendar for any CHP related events.
- Some of the activities that were mentioned as being planned for this coming year are: broomball (which can not be held every quarter contrary to one suggestion due to financial issues), a game night each quarter, Battle of the Brains (where faculty members compete against students in answering trivia), a CHP night at UCI basketball where a CHP student would sing the national anthem, a possible CHP formal, a jazz night by Professor McWilliams's band in House 1020 in spring and in Loma in fall, and the annual CHP banquet (which may or may not be held in Emerald Bay depending on if it is still open during construction).
- For Battle of the Brains, it was mentioned that we need to start planning soon.
- Christina Zabat-Fran stated that the goal is to have some activity after each CHSC meeting such as some dinner or game night.
- Christina Zabat-Fran then stated that the penny drive ends on October 17 at exactly 5PM with the money going toward Locus. Last year, the \$400 collected went toward the Locus and the CHP banquet. Mark suggested using some of the money from the penny drive to paying for coffee hour, to which Erkki proposed using the penny drive to fund a fund for random CHP activities, with expenditures made at the discretion of both the treasurer and the president. Wendy Tanamai, the vice president of student affairs, then explained how a penny drive works.
- Bhishma then went over some ideas that he had for fundraising, including having contestant-based eating of hamburgers with leftover hamburger buns, -athons such as a wake-a-thon, a jog-a-thon, or a homeless-a-thon, and selling yogurt at the Ring Road vendor fair. Erkki commented that last year there was consideration of having people trying to out-bench-press Erkki with Erkki contributing money to CHP for each person out-bench-pressing him.
- Christina Zabat-Fran then described community service activities for this coming year including gleaning (going to fields in Irvine where there is not a good yield of food and picking for Second Harvest, with the main gleaning being in mid January) and adopting a large family for Christmas. In addition, Christina said that CHSC is looking for a community service chair.
- Salpy and Doug then described social activities planned for this year including broomball at Glacier Gardens the next day, Game Night possibly at the Shire possibly on October 22nd after CHSC, the Halloween Dance at House 1006 on October 31st, and New Slate, an undergraduate dance show in 10th week. Salpy and Doug are hoping for greater awareness of cultural events such as OCPAC, and they stated that if CHP HAs and RAs need help planning for an event, that they can talk to Salpy and Doug.

- Christina Zabat-Fran then stated that she is hoping to have a guide of Orange County activities and places of interest.
- With regard to the CHP T-shirt, Christina Zabat-Fran indicated that designs are due at the CHSC meeting 4th week for voting and that these designs should be smart, witty, and have minimal colors.
- Christina Zabat-Fran stated that she hopes to have people get more involved in activities.
- Two general announcements were that Loma had bundles of apples and that Bhishma was doing a barbeque in CV on Sunday.
- The PAAs said that some of the activities that they are hoping to do are a trip to game show taping over a weekend (in fact, for Price is Right, if at least 20 or 25 people come, 1 spot is guaranteed) and going to either the Arrowhead Improv or the Bren Improv comedy show.
- There was then an announcement about Karioke Night at the Shire.
- Christina Zabat-Fran, just before adjourning the meeting, held a 2-week toast, with the goal being to toast whatever people want to be thankful for in the past 2 weeks.
