INITIAL CALL TO ORDER

- Christina Zabat-Fran, the president, started the meeting in the Locus at 6:02 PM.
- There was one handout, an agenda.
- Christina Zabat-Fran said that Wendy Tanamai, Peter, and Katie Kosaka were providing pizookies for the after-event.
- Christina Zabat-Fran then thanked everyone for filling out the evaluations and said that CHSC will try to address the concerns.
- Christina Zabat-Fran then thanked Salpy for planning the Semiformal. Salpy replied by saying that CHSC made \$200 to \$300 in profit and that around 120 people attended.

CHSC OPPORTUNITIES

- Christina Zabat-Fran announced that people were needed to help out with coffee hour and that Chris Clark and Mark Lawrence were helping out that week.
- Christina Zabat-Fran then reminded everyone that there were only two more weeks left for CHiP in the quarter and that quarterly awards were going to be announced at the Week 10 meeting.
- Ashley Brenner said that high school seniors might not be comfortable dancing at the Stay Over Program dance, and Maria Sakata said that she was willing to help plan it.
- Ashley Brenner asked the CHP HAs and RAs to sell Finals Care Packages and asked everyone to encourage others to purchase them. Christina Zabat-Fran announced that they were going to be on sale from after the meeting through Friday of Week 10 and that they were going to be made at 2 PM on Friday of Week 10.

WAYZGOOSE

- Fuzlul Zubair said that Wayzgoose is a carnival in Aldrich Park and a campus open house for freshman outreach.
- Christina Zabat-Fran said that CHSC has a large cookie booth and needs help with manning the booth, baking cookies, and doing publicity.
- She then said that our 8 ft by 8 ft square booth was starting to fall apart and that people would need to get it out of Professor McWilliams's lab to work on it sometime during the following four weeks. Mark Lawrence, Brian Oglesby, and David Choy volunteered to help out.
- Christina Zabat-Fran then announced that CHSC's spot is on the lawn near the stage, so that it should be easy to find.
- Andy Schuster said that there were flyers last year that showed where the booth was and offered a deal to draw attention. Fuzlul Zubair said that this got lots of attention but was not as effective as it could have been due to being in a bad location.
- Mark Lawrence suggested getting a better roof.

BATTLE OF THE BRAINS

- Ryan Lombardini said that everyone should have gotten an email through CHP-news asking for volunteers. He said that people who wanted to be contestants were to email either himself or Erkki and that possible volunteers were to email him. He said that the next committee meeting was going to be the following Thursday at 5 PM.

- He stated that Battle of the Brains will be Wednesday of Week 2 for Spring Quarter, and Christina Zabat-Fran said that this was causing the first few CHSC meetings of Spring Quarter to be Wednesday of Weeks 1,3,and 4.

****RECRUITMENT & RETENTION****

- Christina Luiz said that she still needed one person to help out with Academic Talent Search on March 13, Honors Experience Day, at UCLA and one person to help out on April 3, the last Saturday of Spring Break, at UCI.
- She then said that Pro Fro was going well with the next day being the last night for it. She then said that there was free pizza, chips, and soda and that Erkki was able to look up the names of people from one's high school.
- Christina Luiz then stated that, with CHiP, points can only be tabulated if people sign in.

****CLUB NETWORKING****

- Christina Luiz said that she attended the Anteater Leadership Forum with Emily. She said they learned how to network with other clubs and found out the benefit to working with other clubs. Christina also said that they learned about parking and fundraising.
- Christina Zabat-Fran said that Karishma Datye had been talking with Circle K about service opportunities and that some clubs that CHSC might work with in the future include Winners' Circle, Golden Key, and ASA.

****STAY-OVER PROGRAM****

- Salpy said that Ashley Brenner had suggested holding an activity such as Texas Hold 'Em, Mafia, or a Game Night instead of the dance. Mark Lawrence replied by saying that the Spring Quarter Game Night was supposed to be in Loma. Christina Luiz responded by saying that the CHP dance might mean that hosts do not take guests to fraternity parties. Amber Lakhani said that guests might think of the CHP dance as a high school activity. Neeta Joshi mentioned that a dance might not be as important since fewer hosts will be in Arroyo Vista. Andy Schuster said that frat parties are not the purpose of the Stay-Over Program.
- It was mentioned that, during the first week, other activities should be held in the Arroyo Vista Houses.
- Neeta Joshi suggested that Mark Lawrence and Fuzlul Zubair can decide on activities and plan them for the Shire and Loma. Fuzz suggested theming coffee hour and said that the UCI experience should not be falsified, while Christina Zabat-Fran replied that the goal was to have activities in Arroyo Vista to take the burden off of the RAs of Loma and the Shire.

****ANNOUNCEMENTS****

- Neeta Joshi announced that she, along with Lauren Brothers, were hosting Coach Gumby, Professor Anderson, to speak on LGBT issues.
- Ashley Brenner asked people who wanted to make comments for the Constitution to email her.
- James Wenner asked people whether they wanted to attend the musical Urinetown or Oklahoma. There were two votes for Oklahoma, and Urinetown won overwhelmingly. He promised more information at the next meeting.
- Christina Zabat-Fran announced that Marsh Tours were going to be given that Friday by the PAAs, that there was a trip to the opera that Saturday and that those interested were to speak to her as soon as possible, that HA and RA interviews were going to be that Sunday, that Ryan Lombardini was going to show School of Rock at Arroyo Vista House 1006 the next Monday at 8 PM, and that Honors Experience Day was going to be the Saturday of Week 9.
- Christina Zabat-Fran announced that, for the Week 10 CHSC meeting, a leprechaun was going to explode in the Locus since it was going to be St. Patrick's Day. She said there was going to be a Winter Quarter tally for CHiP and that the after event was going to be watching 21 Grams and making green cookies.
- Ryan Lombardini said that Professors Moeller and Lupton were going to Loma on Wednesday of Week 10 to hold a question and answer session before the Humanites Core final.
- It was announced that Friday of Week 10 was going to be CHP Staff Appreciation Day, where CHSC was going to feed the CHP staff and present them with a large card. One gift idea was a football phone.
- Jen Hsia asked people to send an email to CHP-PAA to let her know if they wanted to attend the Marsh Tour.
- A two week toast was held, it was announced that CHSC was going to start right at 6 PM in the future, and Christina Zabat-Fran adjourned the meeting at 6:38 PM.
